The Newton win streak started Dec. 11, 1959, when they defeated South Hall, 71-51. And over Bradley's 10-year coaching reign the Rams have posted a 271-28 record making trips to the State AA tournament seven out of the last eight years.

Although he hasn't yet signed a college grant-in-aid, it's believed that the name of Chadwick will be continued in "Big-Orange County."
