For 13 years, Bradley has been coaching the Newton County Rams and Friday night he passed another in a series of milestones at this Class AAA school as he won his 350th career game here.

In that span, he's lost only 42 games.

Newton County, rated ninth in the state on the strength of its 17-3 record, put it on visiting Therrell Friday night, 86-45, and the Panthers never had a chance.

It was a good milestone victory because it was typical Bradley — smooth offense, winning defense, and a chance

for nearly everybody to get in the game.
