"That was a great team," recalled Newton High School Principal David Easterday of the 1981 players. "That team had some athletes."

against third-ranked Wheeler High School for a chance to play for the AAAAA state championship. The game begins at 5:30 p.m.


Senior Tiffany Sands, a varsity cheerleader for the past four years, said there hasn't been this much excitement at Newton High in a long time.

"Wheeler is a strong team, but I think we can pull through," she said. "They have so much talent."
