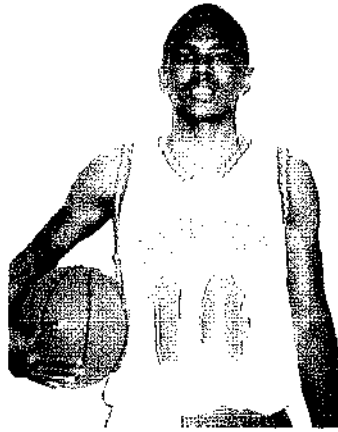

## A REVIEW OF SENIORS' CAREER

The 2005 version of the Newton High Rams boys basketball team featured the excellent leadership of our outstanding seniors. Two of these, Brandon Finch and John Monk, were members of three varsity teams which have a combined record of 63-26, a Region Championship, and a Final Four appearance. The following young men have played a most vital role in the successes these Rams and their fans have enjoyed and will be greatly missed as they make their venture into future endeavors.



**#5 TRENT BROWN** - Probably the biggest surprise on the team was the effort and improvement of Trent. Playing on the varsity for the first year, he could always be counted on for a great effort as at times he played all the positions on the court. Trent was always dependable when the pressure was at the highest level. His highest scoring game was 11 vs. Rockdale. He had a high of 6 assists vs. Rockdale and had 5 steals vs. N. Forsyth. He reached double figures in rebounds vs. Lassiter with 10, and made all of his free throws on 5 occasions. He scored 106 points and had 113 rebounds for the season.



**#14 BRANDON FINCH** - Playing on the varsity for the third year, Brandon's strength was his effort, quickness and experience. Probably Brandon's greatest contribution, in addition to effort and team play, was his great defense. He constantly shouldered a lot of responsibility in stopping the opponent's best player. He led the Rams in several categories for the season:

Most assists (183, 5.9 per game)

Most steals (111, 3.6 per game)

Most assists (11 vs. Heritage)

Most steals (9 vs. Douglass)

100% F.T. (on 6 occasions)



**#24 TODD HOSKINS** - One of the biggest contributions to the Rams' success this season was the addition of Todd. He scored a total of 433 points for a 14 points per game average. Todd got better and better as He led the team in scoring in all four state tournament games. His best game was in the great comeback against Lithonia when he was 7 of 11 in FGA with 10 of 11 FT, as he scored 27 points and had 5 assists. He led The team this year in the following individual categories for the season:

Most free throws (114)

Best FT % (77%, 114 of 149 attempts)

Most Consecutive FT (23 without a miss)

**#32 RUDY NOLLEY** - Rudy has been a starter for the two years he has been a member of the varsity basketball team. His leadership was much in evidence in many ways. His maturity and experience were a major part of the Rams success this season. His top two scoring games were 19 points vs. Heritage and against Douglass. The 6'4" jumping-jack led the Rams in the following highs for the season:

- Leading offensive rebounder (97 OR, 3.1 per game)
- Leading defensive rebounder (174 DR, 5.9 per game)
- Leading rebounder (271 TR, 8.7 avg. per game)
- Most blocked shots (19, .6 per game)

He also led the team in the following individual categories:

- Best FG % (8 of 10 vs. Heritage)
- Best FG % (100% on 6 occasions)



**#44 JOHN MONK** - One of two members of this year's team who have been on the varsity for three years, John's effort and leadership was a key factor in the Ram's success this year. Called upon to play center, the toughest spot on the floor, at 6'2" he was continually looking up to the tall centers who reached 6'10" on several occasions. John's best scoring night was in an overtime loss to Douglass as he scored 15 points. He scored 100 points and had 96 rebounds for the season. John Monk led the team in two categories for the season:

- Best FG % (63%, 44 of 70 attempts)
- Charges taken (10)



## A GLANCE AT THE UNDERCLASSMEN

### JUNIORS

**#22 JERRELL BOSWELL** - The junior two-year starter has proven to be one of the most exciting Ram players in recent years. Jerrell was honored by the Atlanta TipOff Club by being named to the Team of the Month. He was also named to the 2005 2AAAAA all-region team, and was listed as 2<sup>nd</sup> team All-State. In addition, Jerrell topped the prestigious 1,000 Point mark in the home Stephenson game. He was the team's leading scorer in 20 games this season. He led the team in the following individual game categories:

- Most FG (11 vs. Heritage)
- Most 3 pt. FG (9 vs. Lithonia)
- Total FG (15 vs. Lithonia)
- Most FT (tied with 11 vs. Douglass)
- Most points in a Quarter (19 vs. Rockdale)

- Most points in a Game (41 vs. Lithonia)

He also had the following individual highs for the season:

**#21 ARMANI MARIE** - Played in 7 games this season. With one year left, Armani has an excellent chance of improving and contributing in the future. His pleasant attitude and willingness to help in any way meant much to the team.

**#34 LARRY SHEPPARD** - Played in 5 games this season. He made valuable contributions to the team by playing the post position vs. starters, and will continue to improve, helping in any way he is asked.

### SOPHOMORES

**#3 JAMAHL MADDOX** - Played in 6 games this season while also playing on the JV team. Jamahl continues to improve and with experience, will be counted on to contribute much in the future.

**#11 MARK THOMAS** - Played in 18 games this season: scored 20 points and had 11 rebounds. A good shooter, Mark is expected to fill some of the vacancies left by this year's seniors, and with two years left, should be well-known throughout the area.

**#12 WALTER FORTSON** - The tallest player on the Rams team, Walter scored 25 points this season, including a high-point game of 11 vs. Monroe; he also had 8 rebounds and 2 blocked shots. Walter is expected to add more to his height, and with the playing time he will have next year, will be a factor to be reckoned with by opponents.

### FRESHMAN

**#33 SEAN MONK** - Sean saw limited playing time in 20 games this season. He scored 24 points (including 16 vs. Rockdale in his first varsity game) and added 12 rebounds to his stats. Sean is expected to become an outstanding player as he gains experience, growth, and maturity. His size, as well as his competitive attitude, will be a big advantage to him.

## A GLANCE AT AN AMAZING SEASON

This year's 2005 Newton High Rams boys basketball team was one of the most surprising in recent school history. The members of this team had not been born the last time a NHS boys basketball team had been to the state semi-finals. They were entering the largest classification in one of the toughest regions in the state, as five of the eight teams were involved in the state playoffs last year. The Rams were hoping to add a third straight trip to the state tournament, but the competition was very keen. Last year's team had graduated seven, so the Rams were facing a tough season without much experience.

This new group of seniors, one veteran junior, along with a good supporting cast, served notice early in the season with a very exciting win over state-ranked Riverdale, 62-61 in their first Region 2-AAAAA game. The first of two sell-out games vs. Eastside saw the NHS gym doors locked early, and the fans who were able to get in were treated to a 52-45 win.

The Rams went into January with a 9-3 record, and raised eyebrows when they went to Redan to play the state-ranked Raiders. As they entered the gym dressed in their matching coats and ties, several people standing outside asked if they were a choir. They played beautiful music that night, and "sang" all the way home to a 65-60 victory. Later in January, the Rams made the trip across town to Eastside, and played before another full house and came away with a very exciting 53-52 victory.

Sporting a 14-4 record, they traveled to Lithonia where one of the most spectacular games ever was played. The Rams trailed 68-54 at the end of 3 quarters, but they put on a fantastic show and comeback as they hit on 12 of 19 shots in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter, and scored 39 points during those final 8 minutes, for an amazing 93-86 win over the 2004 semi-final team.

Entering the region tournament as a #3 seed, the Rams continued to amaze fans as they again trailed Lithonia by 8 points with 5 minutes left in the game. Once again they showed their "heart" and their "fighting spirit" as they rallied to win 64-56 to earn a spot in the AAAAA State Tournament. In the semi-finals of the region, the Rams trailed host team Douglass by 11 at halftime, cut the deficit to 7 by the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter, and won in an exciting finish, 53-49. The loss in the region finals to state-ranked Stephenson, did not dampen their spirit and the Rams made plans to stop a 5-game streak of losses in the first round of the State Tournament.

For the first time in school history, the Rams were to host the first game of the state tournament due to their #2 finish in the Region Tournament. The NHS team was considered an underdog as they faced state-ranked E. Coweta, who sported a 22-6 record. The Rams trailed by 5 at halftime, cut the deficit to 2 by the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter, rallied to win 45-37, and earned a much-coveted trip to Macon Coliseum for the "Sweet 16".

There they were to meet one of South Georgia's largest and most talented team, the Region 3-AAAAA champion Lowndes County who had a front line of 6'9, 6'8, 6'5. As had become customary, the Rams trailed 24-23 at halftime, but thanks to a spectacular 2<sup>nd</sup> half, they rallied to win 62-41, earning the esteemed honor of getting to the "Elite Eight" (and along with those who had participated in many other games, gave Coach Bradley win #1,300). Newton was once again to face (for the 4<sup>th</sup> time) region foe, Douglass, who sported 4 major college athletes on their squad. The Rams had another spectacular win over the Astros as they once again rallied, made 21 of 40 field goal attempts and shot 53% from the field, to earn an unbelievable spot in the Final Four!

For the first time in three decades, the NHS Rams had won three games in the state tournament. The other three teams were all state-ranked and had spectacular records. The Rams were to face the outstanding, nationally-ranked Wheeler team which had won 2 of the previous 3 State Championships and had a 29-1 record. They had defeated South Gwinnett, the defending state champion and the nation's 6-ranked team, featuring a player who is said to be going straight to the NBA, to also get to the Final Four.

The loss in the State Semi-finals before a large crowd of Newton fans hurt, but the memories of a fantastic year filled with many thrills and much excitement will never be forgotten by those who were fortunate enough to experience it. The Rams final record of 21-10 and their great showing in post-season play was so strong that they finished in 6<sup>th</sup> place in the State AAAAA Rankings.

The fundamentals, discipline and the "heart" with which *each* of these young men played won the hearts and admiration of their fans. As an example of the effort they continually displayed--their *never quit* attitude--they trailed at the half in 11 of their last 12 games, but came back to win 7 of those. Their conduct, as well as their appearance, generated many favorable comments from strangers who made it a point to compliment them. They represented their team, their coaches, their school, and their families well, and we all are very proud of them and their many accomplishments. It will be exciting to watch them in the future, and know they will carry lessons learned with them for many years.

To the seniors we say, there are many youngsters out their watching and waiting to move up to your spot. Your uniform and your locker may be used by others, but you will never be *replaced*. It is our hope that you have learned many things in the face of such competition which will serve you as you go down life's pathway. It is our desire that should you meet a bump in the road, you will be able to reach down and pull out something you have learned that will help you over it. When you reach a fork in the road, we pray that you will make right choices to the benefit all concerned. It is said that we learn from all those with whom we are associated---some we learn *what* to do---some we learn what *not* to do. Choose wisely.

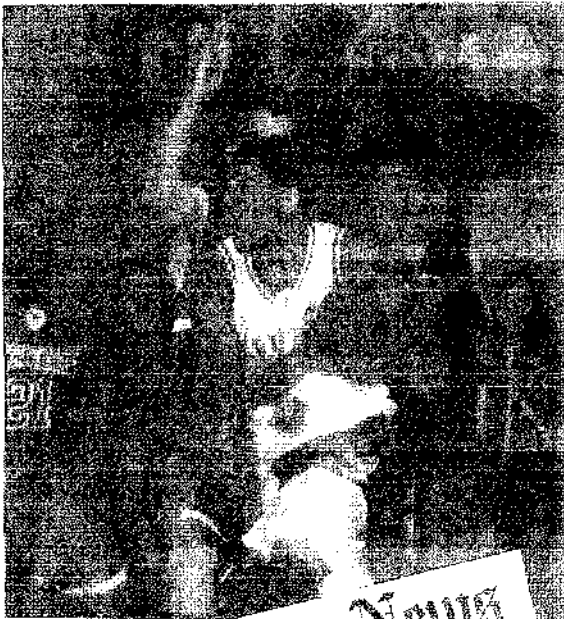
ATLANTA — Newton's basketball team has made something of a tradition of going to the state tournament under coach Ron Bradley.

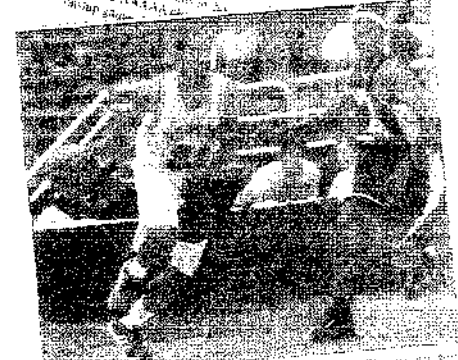

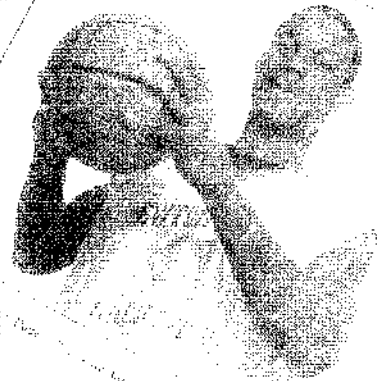

# End of an era

## Legendary coach steps aside

Bradley's time spent after 40 seasons and more than 1,000 wins

### Great things

It's hard to believe, but I have coached in the states, in the district schools and I still have a basket of games.

Bradley and the coaching profession were parted ways Tuesday after a day when he was retired as head coach of the Newton High School boys' basketball team after 40 seasons on one bench or another.

It ends where it started with an astonishing 1,291 victories, 24 regionals, 11 state finals appearances and three state championships to his credit.

"It's been 45 years," Bradley said. "I've felt all along that it was the year. At 70, Bradley steps aside after leading the Rams to 24 victories, three consecutive state tournament berths and their first Final Four appearance since 1985. He considers it "the most surprising season he has ever been through, and although he stands on shying away from it, he has not closed the door entirely on a possible

return. Who could blame him? "I've coached for a while," Bradley said. "I know, but when you have an opportunity to come down, it's through coaching."

most important part in his life — believing he has touched his final game. "My wife has said she won't touch any more," Bradley said. "She's the one who will live with it."

Bradley is a friendly and easygoing man, a former Massachusetts state coach. He is a former assistant under coach

The "what makes Bradley different from everyone else" cases, genuinely about the people who care themselves, almost those who want their lives to amount to something. If he's a professional at anything, it's at making people feel like they matter.

The next time I met him to talk with Ron Bradley, was in January of 2000, a few days prior to his gym dedication at Turner Lake Park. I had my feet under me by then, and he and his wife Jan sat across the table from me and gave me my first glimpse of their wonderful world. We talked about everything under the sun — and some things above it — but most by we discussed people.

Near the end of our time together, Bradley said he remains "curious about his career as a coach. He knows he took a breath and, with tears welling in his eyes, introduced me to Betty Jean Rinkler, one of his former players who showed the healthy shades before I was born.

But he cares deeply about people, which is why he has been so successful for such a long time. He was no cookie-cutter philosophy. He used the use of generations, covered actual barriers and bridged really different eras.

Oddly enough, I was standing on a rooftop field — not a basketball court — the first time I crossed paths with the great Ron Bradley. And in his case, the word "great" fits like Dorothy's red slipper in the Wizard of Oz.

At the end of the day, I pulled into the parking lot at Piedmont Academy in Monticello and walked up to the man I had only heard about. My hand, extended on a hand, mid-summer morning.

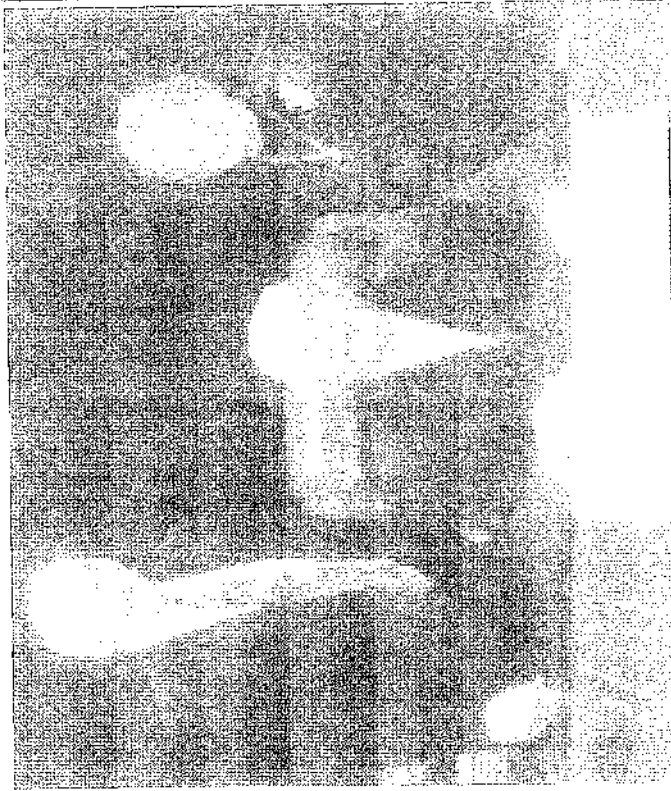

### Newton's Bradley given citation by Gov. Perdue

**ATLANTA** — The final part of 2005 has been a great one for Newton High basketball coach **Ron Bradley**.

Not only did he win his 45th basketball game, he took a career-best 47th win by leading the Newton team to a 47-16 record. He was named Georgia Coach of the Year for the 11th time.

"You're receiving a lot of recognition for your coaching career," said Bradley. "I've had a lot of other people that have been of great support through the years."

"When you receive an honor of this magnitude there's really a lot of young people receiving that honor, it's not just one person."

Bradley, basketball and golf teams. But basketball is Bradley's true love. He has coached approximately 1,655 basketball games winning 1,302 of them — an impressive winning percentage of .787.

As he talks his days to young people for 45 years one would think that Bradley had had enough. But the resident coach and his wife Jan are not sure if they're ready to stop yet.

"I've always been told, 'Don't try to make a decision while you're too high or too low.' We've been at this for a long time and have talked about retiring because we've retired two other times," said Bradley.

"But we still enjoy what we do and I still have a passion for it."

Many years ago I quickly learned what type of person Ron Bradley was with the media.

Despite all his career wins and his legendary status, Bradley never minded talking about his team. If he won by 30 or lost by 25, Bradley was believed in giving his players as much publicity as possible. He always put the spotlight on them.

From that standpoint, he was a sports writer's best friend. He always knew every stat imaginable from past games. He returned your phone calls in a prompt manner. He was always thankful you had called seeking information on his team.

Yet, the story of Ron Bradley goes much deeper. He will be forever tied to Walton County athletics working as a coach at both George Walton Academy and Loganville High School.

I have talked with numerous people who say their lives have been so positively impacted by Bradley. It's amazing the impact a coach can have on a young person. For those who don't understand the value of high school athletics, I urge you to spend some talking with Ron Bradley. He'll quickly change your mind.

In terms of basketball, few can match what Bradley has done at the high school level. His career win total of 1,301 may never be matched in Georgia. Already a member of the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame, Bradley will do a little traveling during retirement and spend some time with his favorite scorekeeper, his wife Jan.

While I know he deserves to enjoy retirement, part of me truly wishes he would return to coaching. His positive influence on anyone he is associated with is something our students need more of these days.

# Storybook sendoff: Rams write ideal ending

**I**t was a fitting bookend — if this is the end — to an unrivaled coaching career that spanned 10 United States presidencies. Yes, 10.

The Newton High School boys' basketball team won 21 games, challenged for a championship in what most would argue is the state's toughest region and advanced to the Final Four for the first time in 23 years.

Consider it a going away present for head coach Ron Bradley, who retired from coaching Tuesday after 45 years on the sidelines.

“I thought it was the most surprising team I've ever been a part of,” Bradley said. “I went in thinking we'd be thrilled just to have a winning season. When we saw the schedule, we weren't sure we'd win a road game. We won five of the seven.”

None of his regulars — from Todd Hoskins to Trent Brown to Rudy Nolley to John Monk — stood taller than 6-foot-4. None of them, except for Jerrell Boswell, was regarded as superstar material outside the inner circle. Yet for more than 15 weeks, they walked among giants, paying attention only to that which was in their control.

The Rams were underdogs in each of their three state tournament victories, first to non-ranked East Coweta, then to 1-A AAAA champion Lawrence and finally to region rival Douglass.

What the Rams accomplished between November and March won't soon be forgotten. They were two wins shy of their first state championship in 41 years when they fell to eventual champion Wheeler, a team that did not lose a single game in state all year.

“That Newton even made it that far, no one would argue, bordered on the miraculous.”

“We had a group of youngsters with a lot of heart,” Bradley said. “Obviously, we wish we could have played better against Wheeler, but even though we lost in Atlanta, it was awesome to be a part of.”

What's even more staggering is to consider the fact that Newton survived longer and accomplished more than did nationally ranked South Gwinnett, which went home in the round of eight.

“All good things could tell this team was going to be something special,” Bradley said. “But to get to the Final Four? No one could have dreamed that.”

Bradley had his first premonition at least publicly that something unimaginable was about to occur on the horizon in late January when a state-dedicated Lathonia 93 after a 10-day holiday by as many as 16 points in the fourth quarter.

Not since Carl Stevenson scored 39 points and led Newton back from 17 points down with 1:51 to go against Cedar Shoals in 1974 had he witnessed such a surreal move by one of his teams. He knew then the impossible was possible.

“They're just amazing,” Bradley said afterwards. “It will be interesting to see if they're destined to do something unusual.”

They were and they did.

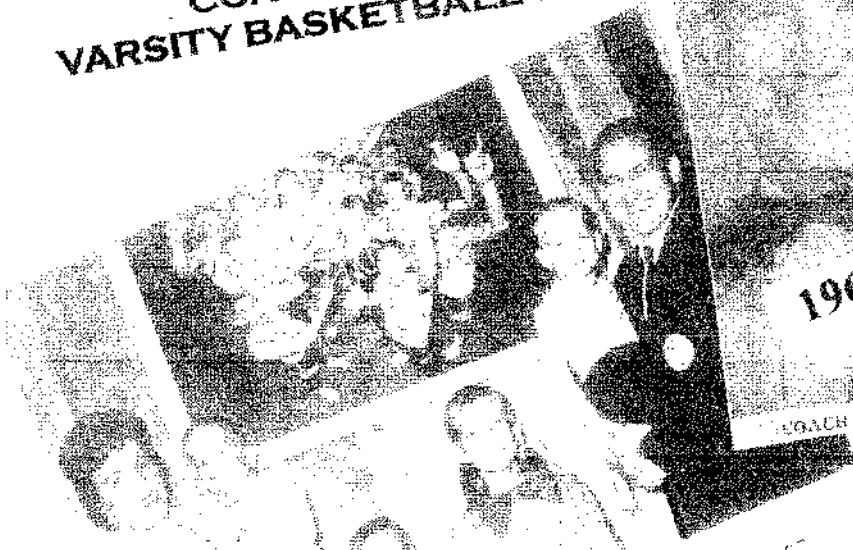

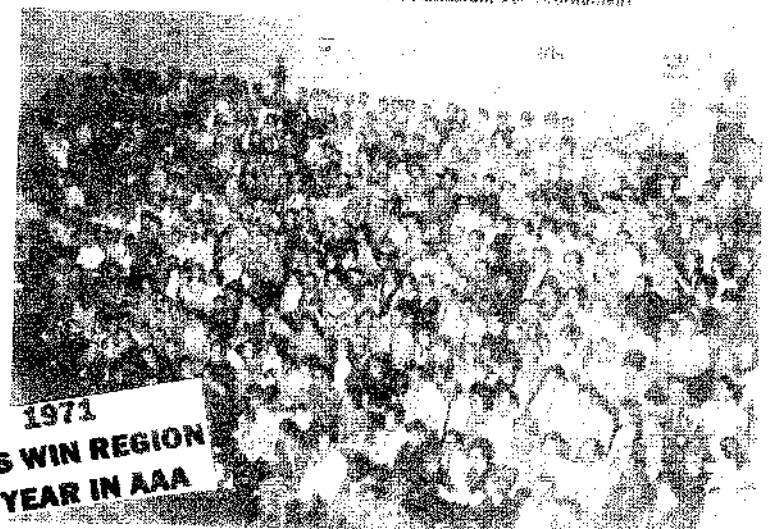
