The second annual meeting and first annual club shoot of the Lakeside Gun Club will be held Sunday, June 7, 1964 at the gun club site at City Pond.


Shooting will begin at 2 p. m. with any guage competition of 25 targets with ties to be decide by shooting 25 additional targets.
